Why do you need to be recognised as an 'industry organisation'?

Safeguards growers and producers by ensuring:

- The organisation represents them
- They want to be part of GIA
- They support the way they'll be represented
- They support the funding method

Requirements in the Biosecurity Act

The organisation must:

- be a body corporate
- represent the sector
- consult the sector
- have a funding strategy

Applying to be named an industry organisation

The organisation must represent the sector.

What you need to tell the Minister:

- What sector you want to represent
- Who can be members of your organisation
- How much of the sector you represent
- The organisation's accountability mechanisms

Applying to be named an industry organisation

The organisation must have consulted the sector on:

- The proposal to sign GIA
- How the sector's views will be represented
- How to fund GIA

The organisation must show it has had due regard to the views expressed during consultation

Applying to be named an industry organisation

The organisation must have funding arrangements in place
(or a plan for how it will fund its commitments)
