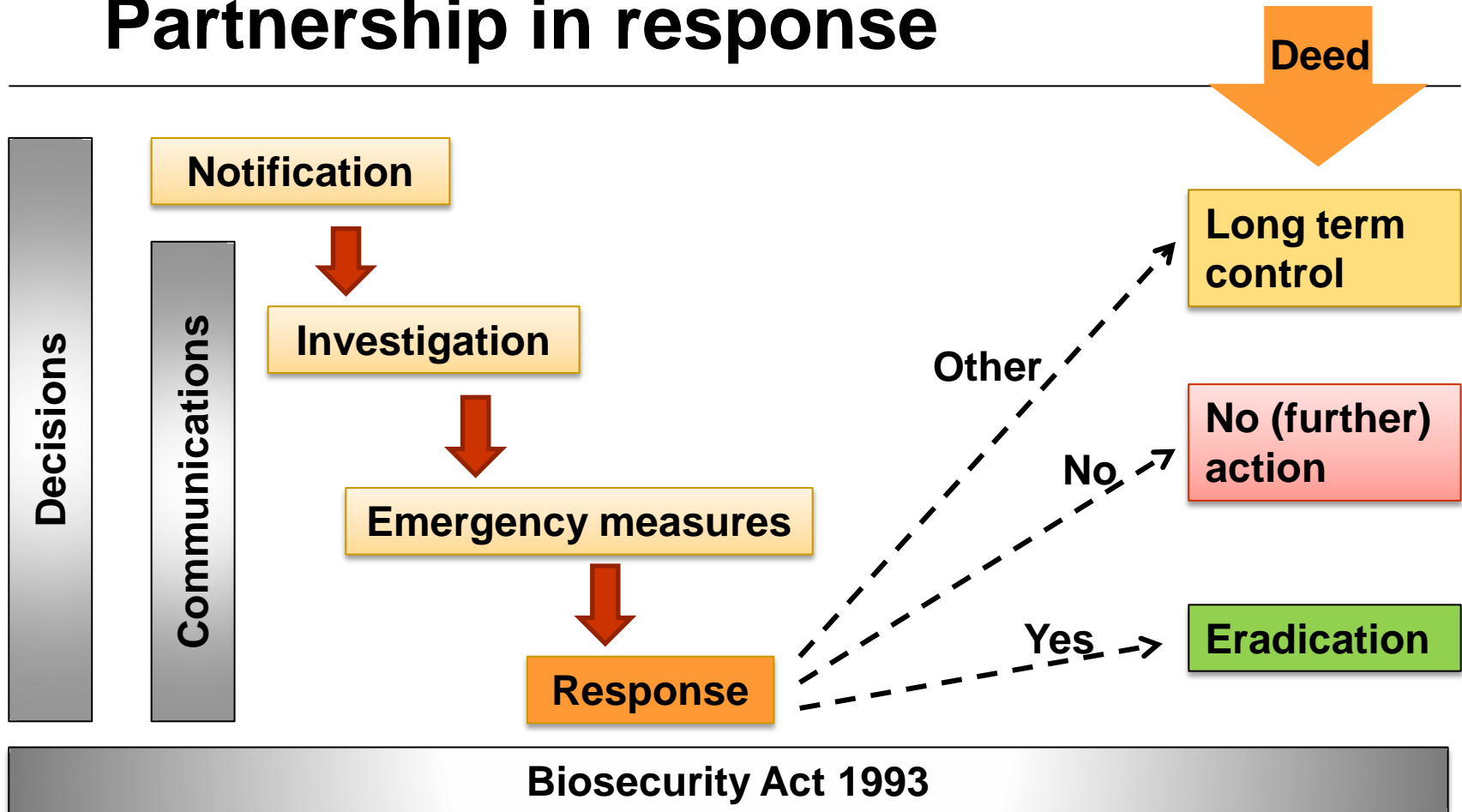
The Biosecurity System



Partnering in readiness

- ❖ You know what your biosecurity risks are and where they are likely to come from
- ❖ Risk pathways are known and effectively managed
- ❖ Risky behaviours can be reduced
- ❖ You have confidence in border biosecurity actions
- ❖ New pests are detected early
- ❖ You know what your response options are – or not
- ❖ Systems for rapid and effective response are in place
- ❖ Affected industries are better prepared, make better decisions
