## Partnering in readiness

- You know what your biosecurity risks are and where they are likely to come from
- Risk pathways are known and effectively managed
- Risky behaviours can be reduced
- You have confidence in border biosecurity actions
- New pests are detected early
- You know what your response options are or not
- Systems for rapid and effective response are in place
- Affected industries are better prepared, make better decisions
